FEATURE ARTICLE: Positive Reinforcement R+ Training is for Every Horse!

Have you recently been hearing about Positive Reinforcement (R+) training? Also known as clicker training, this method is widely used with dogs but has also been shown to be quite effective with horses, helping handlers build a strong relationship based on trust and affirmation. People often think their horse is not a good candidate for R+ training, fearing that the horse will become overly eager or even aggressive if treats are anywhere near. This is exactly the type of horse that needs clicker training the most! The very first thing the horse will learn is that he will not receive any treats unless he behaves respectfully. With consistency and repetition, this becomes such an ingrained behavior that you will no longer have a "food monster." Your horse will learn this respect without any confrontation or reprimand.


R+ is something that can be used on any level of horse, from untrained two-year-old to a seasoned veteran. It is a wonderful first step in building a relationship with a youngster before ever putting a foot in the stirrup. It is also a way to develop more advanced skills at liberty or achieve precision in higher-level movements under saddle.
